▶ Based on independent traffic studies, we have scheduled arrivals at each port to avoid the busiest traffic times

▶ Our vehicle queuing area is large enough to accommodate the maximum number of vehicles allowed on board to avoid traffic delays

▶ We expect an average load of about 400 people and 110 vehicles per trip, and each return journey is expected to take a similar number of passengers and vehicles away

Then why build a ship over twice the size of what is needed? And why would you expect inbound & outbound trips to carry about the same loads?
